**VATICAN DECLARATION ON THE THEME OF HUMAN**

**DIGNITY:** ‘The Vatican’s Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith has recently published a new Declaration on the theme of human dignity, addressing a range of contemporary moral and social issues.

The document, Declaration Dignitas Infinita, on Human Dignity, addresses such issues as poverty, war, the travail of migrants, human trafficking, sexual abuse, violence against women, abortion, surrogacy, euthanasia/assisted suicide, the marginalising of people with disabilities, gender theory, sex change and digital violence. **THE FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION** (last Monday 8<sup>th</sup>

April): ‘Thus the Son of God enters this lowly world. ... He was born in a new condition, for, invisible in his own nature, he became visible in ours. Beyond our grasp, he chose to come within our grasp. Existing before time began, he began to exist at a moment in time. Lord of the universe, he hid his infinite glory and took the nature of a servant. Incapable of suffering as God, he did not refuse to be a man, capable of suffering. Immortal, he chose to be subject to the laws of death.

He who is true God is also true man. ... One nature is resplendent with miracles, the other falls victim to injuries. As the Word does not lose equality with the Father’s glory, so the flesh does not leave behind the nature of our race.

One and the same person – this must be said over and over again – is truly the Son of God and truly the son of man. He is God in virtue of the fact that *in the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.* He is man in virtue of the fact that *the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us.*’ (From a letter of St Leo the Great, Pope, 440-461)

**CHANGE TO SEMINARY SPECIAL COLLECTION**

**METHOD:** ‘Next Sunday, 21st of April, is Good Shepherd Sunday. Traditionally the annual special collection for the provision of the seminary and its students training for priesthood is collected on this Sunday. In addition, parishes contribute the entire collection for that day plus the equivalent of one week’s automatic payments for the month. This can be easily forgotten. As such, we will approach the collection differently this year. i.e. On the 28th of May the diocese will deduct the equivalent of 1/52 of your parishes 2023 planned giving income for the seminary

appeal. Closer to the date you will be sent an email explaining how much money is to be deducted from your account.

This change should make things a bit easier. It also ensures that the diocese receives some income to help fund the training of our seminarians. As it is, our seminary costs far exceed what we receive each year in the collection.’ (From Fr Gerard Aynsley, *Vicar General and Dunedin Diocesan Finance Administrator*)
